The content of your manifesto is decided by you and should tell voters why you want to represent them and why they should vote for you - briefly put, it sets out all your ideas and plans that you will change if elected.

The content of your manifesto could be specifically about the School you study in, about wider campus life or about national issues that you want to see change.
